

Har Tru Rules

It is important that all players that play on the har-tru courts follow these rules.

- 1 Brush the entire court after play or before play if you are first on in the morning.
- 2 Place the brush metal side to the fence after brushing. Don't try and force brush side to fence as bristles will get damaged. You know it's correct if brush easily lies against fence.
- 3 Do not cross the hard court after play as you track wet clay on the court.
- 4 Sign your guest in on the board by the court before you play. Please do this before you start so you don't forget. Members have become better at signing in guests, but this area still has to improve. You should not have to text Mike and ask him to sign in your guest because you forgot. If this area does not improve then guest fees may increase and possibly limiting even more the amount of times a guest can play.

Make a correct line call.

This is how it works-no gray area here. You need to call a ball in or out as soon as the ball lands near the line. If you delay, then it's assumed in. If the ball hits any part of the line it is in!! You must make the call loud enough for your opponent to hear it.

In doubles if you call it in and your partner calls it out it is now in. Call must be unanimous. If not, you lose the point.


