Tennis Tip

Doing so many clinics a week, I feel that every couple weeks a new issues arises that seems to be somewhat common among the groups. The past few weeks we have been addressing the need for variety in one's game. Let's not hit the ball to the same place each time, the same pace, with the same spin. Mix it up!! Let's hit more down the alley, cross angle, some lobs, or anything that keeps your opponents guessing. I would come up with a rough percentage to stick to throughout the match with drives/lobs, cross court/down the alley, and low balls/higher balls. Think of it this way. If a baseball pitcher threw a 100 mph fast ball all the time over the same part of the plate, he would be effective at first. As the game progresses, hitters will adjust and be prepared and by mid game begin hitting this pitch well. Curve balls, change ups, and sliders thrown in with that fastball will keep the batters guessing. You need to be that multidimensional pitcher on the tennis court!!!
