Ed and Jim would round out the 8 player field that will compete for this year's Club Championship. The brackets have been posted and the first round will be played on the morning of Saturday, July 9th. Good luck to all competitors.

My final monthly update will be called **Kramarski Korner**, as it will highlight the extraordinary golf being played by not only Kevin, but also his brother Jim. Kevin recently qualified for the **GAP Philly Amateur Tournament** by shooting a 4 over 74 at Inniscrone CC putting him in the top 12. This advanced him to the Championship, 36 holes in one day played at Union League Liberty Hill and Philadelphia Country Club. In those 36 holes, the Top 32 scores would qualify for the bracket round. Kevin's 3 over par would ultimately be one stroke too many, in what was the lowest cut in the history of the tournament.

His heartbreak would not linger too long as a week later, Kevin and his brother Jim would both finish in the Top 33 scores of the **118th GAP Open Championship** qualifier contested at Riverton Country Club. Kevin would fire a -2, 69, while brother Jim shot a +1, 72. The brothers now move on to the Championship contested over 2 days at the Philadelphia Cricket Club, Wissahickon Course. They will play on July 19th and then the top 60 scores will play the next day to crown a 2 day champ.

If that wasn't enough, Kevin decided to try his hand at a team event, the **27th Four-Player Team** event at North Hills Country Club. Joining forces with **Riverton members, Ben Litt, Matt Ade and David Gall**, the team shot a blistering -9, 133 gross in a 2 better ball of the 4 format. Kevin shot a -2, 69 on his own ball to lead the team. Congrats on this success and good luck at The Open!




Red Solo Cup
